

GIS-IDEAS 2023

Abstract Guidelines

The abstract should provide a summary of the key findings of the paper. Preferably, it should be brief enough for an abstracting journal to use unchanged, and it should fit wholly on the first page of the paper. The word ABSTRACT should be in 12 pt bold face type, 3 lines (12 pt) below the author's address, and centred. There should be 1 line (12 pt) between the word ABSTRACT and the abstract itself. The body of the abstract should be fully justified, in 10 pt italicised type.

Note also that the paper title should be in 14 pt bold face type, 3 lines (14 pt) down, and centered. The author names should be in 12 pt bold face type, centred, and 3 lines (12 pt) below the paper title. The author's affiliation should provide a complete mailing address, and be in 10 pt normal type, 1 lines (12 pt) below the author name, and centred.

The submitted abstract should be written in English and contain between 500 - 600 words. The abstract should contain sufficient but precise information suitable for the evaluation of the paper. The details may include background, aim, concepts, approach, results and conclusion and focus on application of GIS, Remote Sensing, GPS, and Geoinformatics Education to address issues related to our natural, social, and human environment.
